IT Cybersecurity Services – Andy Brienzo, Principal Auditor, presented the findings from the audit. Jeff Maxon, Chief Information Security Officer for the Executive Branch and Director of the Kansas Information Security Office, answered questions from the committee.

Both audits will be distributed to all legislators.

Performance Audit Request

Kristen Rottinghaus, Deputy Post Auditor, reviewed for members the performance audit request on jaywalking citations submitted by Representative Rui Xu. After discussion and questions, Representative Barker made a motion to add the request to the committee's list of potential audit topics for consideration at the spring 2023 meeting. Representative Thompson seconded the motion; motion carried.

Consent Calendar

Kristen Rottinghaus, Deputy Post Auditor, reviewed the consent calendar. The consent calendar included approval of the April 22 meeting minutes and acceptance of the completed performance audits presented at today's meeting. There were no objections, so the items were approved. Representative Tarwater abstained from voting on the April 22 minutes.
